
Conflict Minerals Policy Statement:

TACO Fasteners, Inc. policy is that all metals used in our processes are from reliable, sustainable, and conflict-free sources. In order to meet this standard we will:

- Certify that all potential conflict minerals supplied by vendors have completed their due-diligence in the sourcing of their raw materials and have supplied us with documentation to support this effort.
- Maintain a current listing of our vendor and the associated certifications on file for our customers so that they may also complete their required due-diligence.
- If, at any time, we receive credible evidence that there maybe inappropriate materials introduced to our supply chain, we will initiate and internal investigation to determine the source of materials.
- If a vendor is found to be supplying minerals from any area of concern we will inform the vendor of our findings and issue a corrective action requesting additional information to dispute the findings.
- Should a vendor be not able to provide evidence to dispute the findings, the vendor will be given 90 days to procure another certifiable source.
- If after 90 days and the vendor fails to provide the necessary documentation, TACO Fasteners, Inc. will cease using that vendor until such time as they can certify their metals as conflict free.

This policy shall remain in place until federal legislation requires us to modify or replace it.
